Information Sheet

Travel from and into town

The bus stop for the University Services (18, U18, 418) is located on Dorchester Street, right next to the Bath Spa Railway Station. When you exit the station, turn left and walk about 50 to 100 metres to the new Bath bus station terminal. The bay for the services to the University of Bath is just opposite that terminal on the other side of the road. The University buses are usually Orange or Blue. Please make sure you take the bus to the *University of Bath* (not Bath Spa University).

The bus stop on campus is situated between building 6E and the East Car Park (marked by a  on the attached campus map). The bus service is fairly frequent, however less frequent on Sundays.

Orange buses (Service 18) on Sunday/non-term from the University to the City Centre:

| 8:50 | 9:20 | every half an hour until | 23:20 |

Orange buses (Service 18) on Sunday/non-term from the City Centre to the University of Bath:

| 8:26 | 8:56 | every half an hour until | 22:52 |

The timetable for the Blue buses (Service U18) is attached; buses run slightly more frequently than the Orange buses. Note that the non-term timetable has to be used.

Tickets prices vary between £1 and £2 (depending on the bus company and ticket type).

The bus ride from and to town takes about 10 minutes. The walk between Bath City Centre takes about 20-30 minutes (usually longer going uphill than downhill!).

Facilities on campus

The Parade is the focal point of the campus and where most of the campus facilities can be found. In the centre of The Parade, stands the library. All the main buildings are numbered outwards from the library.

There is a shop on campus which provides a variety of snacks, stationery, etc. The campus also provides excellent sports facilities.

Campus accommodation

All non-local participants will stay on Woodland Court campus accommodation (see attached campus map, top right).

Check In: From 2pm *Check Out:* By 10am (Luggage can be left in the Lecture room).

Keys for Woodland Court can be collected from 11am to 8pm on Sundays from the East Accommodation Centre in the Woodland Court building (see attached campus map, top right - the Accommodation Centre is right at the Entrance to Woodland Court, next to the East Car Park). After 8pm keys can be collected from the Campus Security Team located in the Library on the main Parade (Number 1 on the map).

Description of how to get to Woodland Court from the University Bus Stop (see also attached Campus map): From the bus stop at the university, cross the road between the wooden bus shelter and the steps. On your left should be some stone steps engraved with the university crest leading upwards and ahead of you should be a flat area of grass with some trees. Follow the path that veers to the right across the grass and towards Solsbury Court, the white and grey building with wood cladding. Once you reach this building, you should see a long straight path ahead of you, with Solsbury Court on the left hand side and a grass mound and the East car park on your right hand side. Follow the path right to the end and ahead of you will be Woodland Court. The reception is through the automatic doors on the right.

Talks

The talks will take place in the Department of Mathematical Sciences, which is situated in building 4W (look out for the new-looking building). Tea, coffee and lunches will also be in that building. The Campus is quite small, the walk between 4W and Woodland Court should take less than 10 minutes.

Sunday night dinner

The Parade Bar on campus (situated right at the Parade, 2W on the attached campus map) is open until 10:00pm on Sundays and provides pub food and snacks as well as pizzas and salads at a reasonable price.

Bath City Centre provides a large amount and variety of very good restaurants and pubs, so if you would like to eat in town there are plenty of options. If you miss the last bus to campus there are also taxis available which cost about £10 from the city centre to campus

Breakfast arrangements

Breakfast for all participants who stay on campus has been arranged in Wessex House Restaurant (Number 20 on the campus map, situated between Woodland Court and 4W). Breakfast will be served between 8am and 9am on Monday and Tuesday.

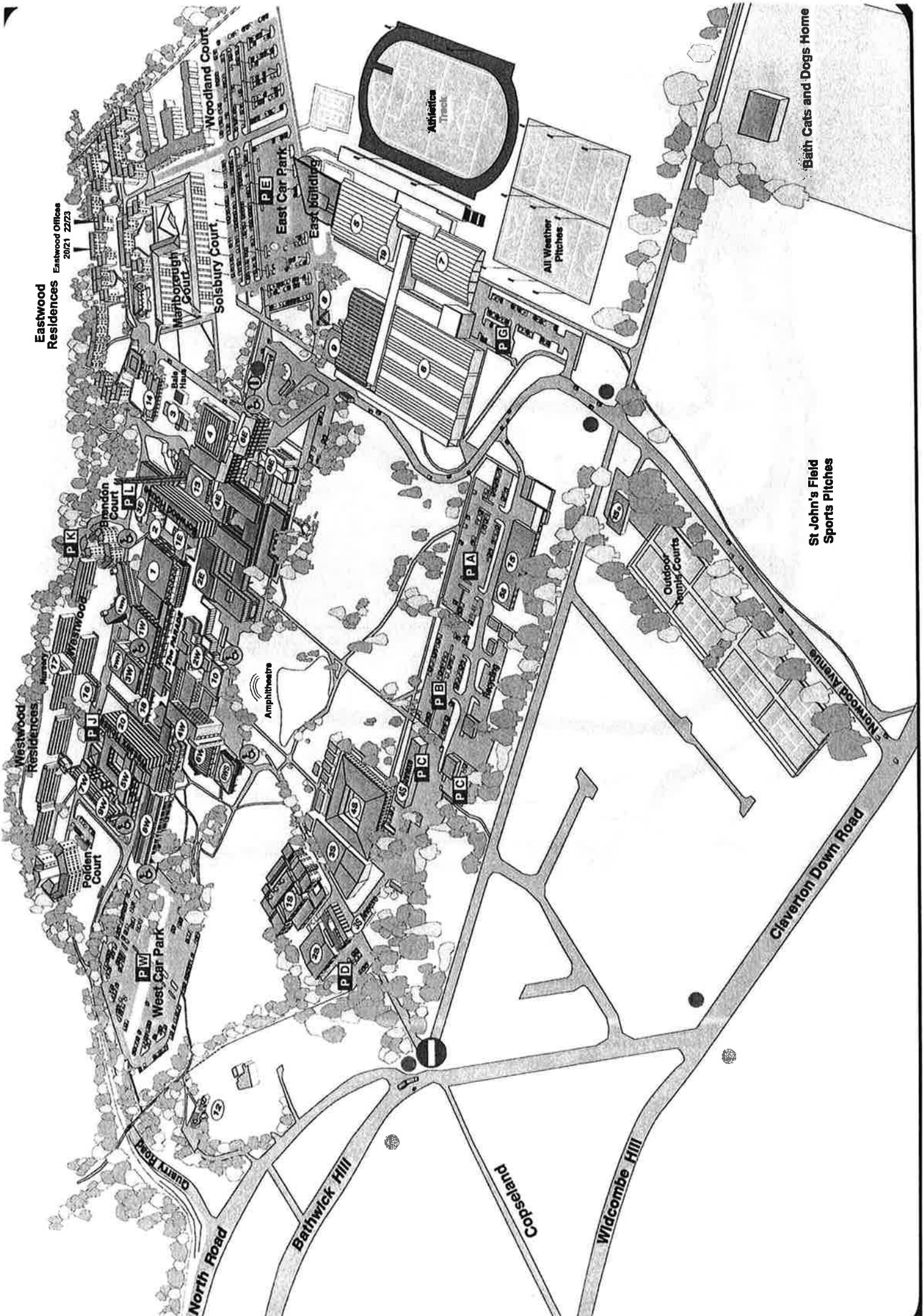
Information about Bath

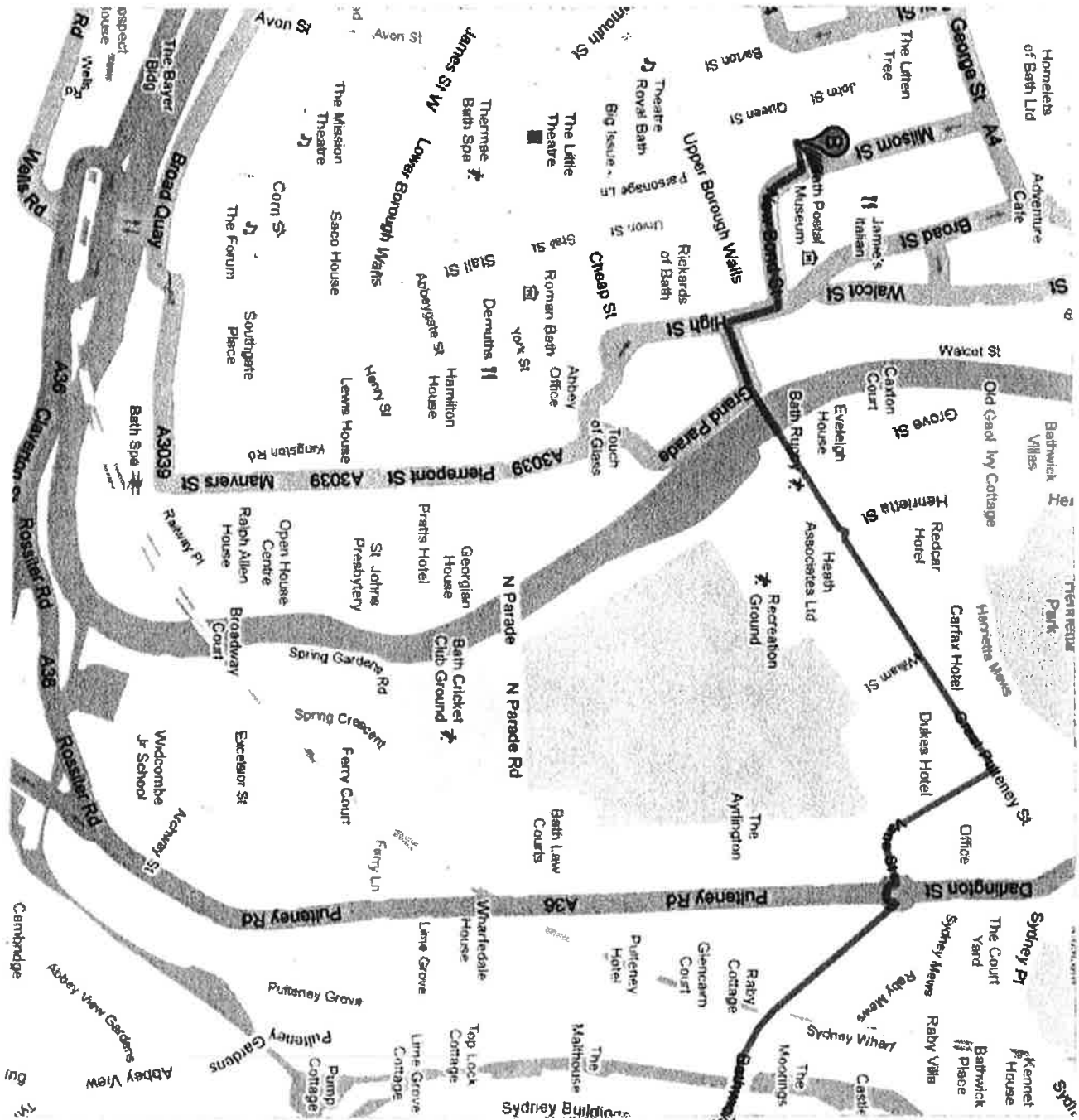
Bath is a World Heritage City and has a lot to offer. Some recommended attractions:

- **Roman Baths:** The Roman Baths and Temple were built around Britain's only hot spring between the 1st and 5th Centuries A.D. The ruins and remains are said to be some of the best in Europe and many artefacts found near the spring, such as coins, jewellery and sculptures, are displayed. You can sample the healing spa water or enjoy tea, coffee or dinner, whilst listening to the classical music ensemble in the beautiful surroundings of the Georgian Pump Room located within the site.
- **Bath Abbey and Heritage Vaults:** Bath Abbey is the last of the great medieval churches in England, and it is built on a site that has housed 3 different churches over the last twelve and a half centuries. Underneath the Abbey are the restored 18th Century cellars which display Abbey related artefacts – some dating from Saxon times.
- **Bus tours:** Take the city tour or skyline tour and explore Bath on one of these open top buses, whilst listening to commentary on the sights. You are free to jump on or off the bus at the different locations and use your ticket to get a discount at some of the attractions.

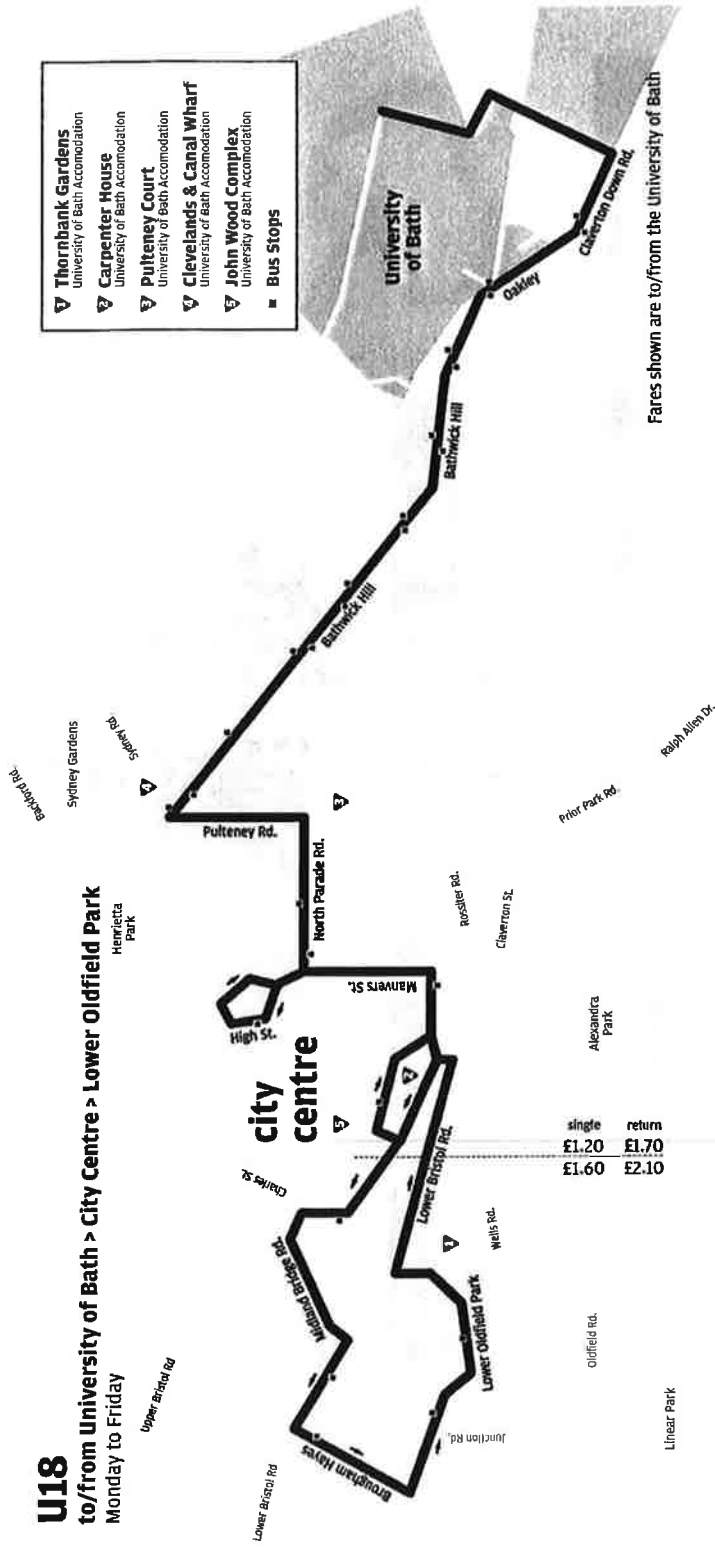
